#### **Old Business**

- Denomination Subcommittee Team
  - Nathan Anderson presented on the current understanding of the process to disaffiliate.
    - Current understanding: two years of apportionments, unfunded pension liability, 2% of the insured property value in the Ezra Report found on line 24.
    - Charter Oak Church has reached out to the Greensburg District Superintendent to schedule the Church Conferences for disaffiliation. Charter Oak Church still does not have those date(s).
    - Charter Oak Church and the Western PA WCA (Wesleyan Covenant Association) are both represented by the law firm of Taylor, Porter, Brooks, and Phillips, L.L.P.
    - An updated timeline and explanation of the meetings (i.e., Charge Conference and Church Conference) and voting process will be communicated to the congregations at each campus once the dates are scheduled.
    - For communication / clarification purposes, there is a difference between a Charge Conference and a Church Conference. A Charge Conference is the annual business meeting of the church, and the only people authorized to vote are Church Council members. A Church Conference is part of the procedure in the disaffiliation process and any member in good standing who attends the Church Conference is eligible to vote.

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- Christina McCaffrey, Nick Watson, Adam Pardee, and Mike Drake discussed the potential ways of financing the future exit from the WPA UMC.


