Is there a minimum age requirement?

 This trip is open to all ages. Children under 18 must travel with a parent, grandparent, or guardian.

What is the cost of the trip?

- Trip cost is set each year based on Big Creek's recommended donation.
- In 2025, the cost of a 4-night trip was \$250 for an adult and \$150 for a child under 18.
- In 2026, the 4-night cost is expected to remain the same. If you choose to stay for 7 nights, the estimate is \$400 for an adult and \$250 for a child.

What is included in the trip cost?

- lodging and meals at Big Creek Missions
- transportation

What is not included in the trip cost?

- clearances
- meals while traveling

When is money due?

at the final pre-trip meeting

What is the refund policy?

- Your deposit is refundable.
- Money donated to Charter Oak Church beyond the deposit is not refundable.

How much spending money should I bring?

- \$50-\$100
- You'll need to pay for breakfast at Cracker Barrel on the drive to Kentucky and lunch (wherever you want to stop) on the drive home.
- Optional expenses include Big Creek merchandise, church offering on Sunday, and ice cream on a work day.

How can I raise money for my trip?

We encourage you to write support letters, and we will provide a sample letter.

What are senders?

 Senders are people called by God to support your trip through prayer, financial gifts, supplies, and other forms of encouragement.

What if I cannot come to the pre-trip meeting?

• The pre-trip meeting is mandatory. Please talk to the missions manager or trip leader in advance about conflicts.

Where do we stay?

• We stay at the Big Creek Missions campus in Bear Branch, Kentucky. The campus has dorm-style rooms with bunk beds and a dining hall where we eat our meals.

How do we get around in Kentucky?

We will travel to serving sites in the vehicles that our team drives to Kentucky.

What will I do?

- Our team will partner with Big Creek Missions in sharing the gospel through words and actions as we meet basic needs in one of the poorest counties in the US.
- Opportunities include projects and repairs at local homes (varying skills levels) and community outreach (home visits, food delivery, food bank, nursing home, etc.).

What should I take?

- We will provide a packing list.
- Bring a heart submitted to the Lord, eyes open to His glory, the humble posture of a learner, and a lot of flexibility!
